

Article III Yard Waste

20-8 PROHIBITED PLACEMENT, BLOWING OR SWEEPING OF YARD WASTE.

20-8.1 Definitions.

As used in this section:

Containerized shall mean the placement of **yard waste** in a trash can, bucket, bag or other vessel, such as to prevent the **yard waste** from spilling or blowing out into the street and coming into contact with stormwater.

Person shall mean any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, or political subdivision of this State subject to municipal jurisdiction.

Street shall mean any street, avenue, boulevard, road, parkway, viaduct, drive, or other way, which is an existing State, County, or municipal roadway, and includes the land between the street lines, whether improved or unimproved, and may comprise pavement, shoulders, gutters, curbs, sidewalks, parking areas, and other areas within the street lines.

Yard Waste shall mean leaves.

20-8.2 Placement of Yard Waste Restricted; Prohibited Acts.

Sweeping, raking, blowing or otherwise placing **yard waste** that is not containerized at the curb or along the street is hereby prohibited prior to 4:00 p.m. of the day previous to the regular scheduled and announced **collection**, and shall not be placed closer than ten (10) feet from any storm drain inlet. Placement of such **yard** at the curb or along the street at any other time or in other manner is a violation of this section. If such placement of **yard waste** occurs, the party responsible for placement of the **yard waste** must remove the **yard waste** from the street or the party shall be deemed in violation of this section. This section shall apply for residential or commercial solid **waste** disposal and to all forms of solid **waste** disposal including that of recycling. (Ord. No. 05-25 § 24-19.1)

20-8.3 Enforcement and Penalties.

Any person who violates any provision of this section shall, upon conviction, be liable to the penalty stated in Chapter I, Section 1-5. This section shall be enforced by the Construction Code Official, the Health Officer and the Police Department. (Ord. No. 05-25 § 24-19.2; New)
