

RESOLUTION 15-11-14 CALLING FOR THE MONMOUTH COUNTY TAX BOARD TO SUSPEND THE MANDATORY ASSESSMENT DEMONSTRATION PILOT PROGRAM

WHEREAS in March 2013, Governor Christie signed into law P.L. 2013, Chapter 15 known as the Assessment Demonstration Pilot Program; and

WHEREAS Monmouth County elected to participate in this Pilot Program, and remains the only County to do so; and

WHEREAS the Borough of Matawan was ordered by the Monmouth County Board of Taxation to implement the Assessment Demonstration Program; and

WHEREAS, the Program requires the Tax Assessor to annually perform a town-wide reassessment, and mandates that 20% of the properties within a municipality be inspected annually, so that 100% of all properties are inspected every 5 years; and

WHEREAS, the program does not fairly and accurately reflect market value, that it inappropriately interfered with local tax assessors, and it inappropriately interfers with local tax assessors, and that it has a disproportionate adverse effect on residential and senior citizen property taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the order, the new revised assessments were certified by the County Tax Board for the 2015 tax year; and

WHEREAS, residents have reported significant fluctuations in their 2015 tax assessments as a result of this Pilot Program, and must make up the difference owed in only six months; and

WHEREAS, the Asbury Park Press published an article dated October 14, 2015 raising numerous questions about the Program; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Buccellato has called for the County Tax Board to suspend this Program and the Council believes that the Mayor's call for the suspension of the Monmouth County Tax Assessment Demonstration Pilot Program is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the Borough of Matawan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the Borough of Matawan formally calls for the suspension of the Monmouth County Tax Assessment Demonstration Pilot Program.

WHEREAS, the New Jersey local Redevelopment and Housing Law, NJSA 40A:12A-1 et seq., authorizes the Borough Council of the Borough of Matawan ("the Governing Body") to adopt by ordinance redevelopment plans for areas in need of redevelopment or rehabilitation; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body previously adopted the Redevelopment Plan (the "Redevelopment Plan") for the Designated Redevelopment Area in the Vicinity of the Matawan Train Station by Ordinance on April 30, 2001; and

WHEREAS, the Unified Planning/Zoning Board of Adjustment of the Borough of Matawan (the "Planning Board") adopted a Master Plan Reexamination Report on November 3, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Master Plan Reexamination Report (the "Reexamination Report") recommended that it has since become necessary to amend the Redevelopment Plan to respond to current market conditions and promote development and redevelopment that is in the best interest of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Unified Planning/Zoning Board of Adjustment of the Borough of Matawan (the "Planning Board") adopted a new comprehensive Master Plan (the "Master Plan"), including an updated Land Use Plan Element on October 6, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Master Plan reaffirms the recommendations set forth in the Reexamination Report regarding the need to update and amend the Redevelopment Plan and finds that the adoption of the revisions to the Train Station Redevelopment Area will jumpstart the redevelopment process around the train station and will complement the revitalization efforts in and around Matawan's downtown; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the New Jersey Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, NJSA 40A:12A-1 et seq. (the "LRHL"), the Governing Body authorized the preparation of an amendment to the redevelopment plan for the Designated Redevelopment Area in the Vicinity of the Matawan Train Station, in the tract defined as Blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, and 11.01, and a portion of Block 11, including Lots 23, 24, 25.01, 26, 27, 29, 30, 40, 41 and 42; and

WHEREAS, the Borough's planning consultant, T&M Associates, has prepared an amendment to the redevelopment plan for the Designated Redevelopment Area in the Vicinity of the Matawan Train Station dated October 22, 2015 (the "Transit Station Redevelopment Plan Amendment"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to NJSA 40A:12-7, the Governing Body referred the Redevelopment Plan Amendment to the Planning Board for review; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that the Redevelopment Plan is necessary and appropriate and will effectuate redevelopment and rehabilitation within the Borough.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Matawan, in the County of Monmouth, that the Redevelopment Plan attached hereto dated October 22, 2015, is hereby adopted.
