T&M Associates (T&M) has been retained by the Borough of Matawan (Borough) to conduct remedial investigations at the Matawan Police Department site, located at 150 Main Street, Matawan, Monmouth County. To date, T&M conducted ground water investigations and a vapor intrusion investigation, in order to meet the regulatory requirements of the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP).

In correspondence dated June 17, 2013, the NJDEP notified the Borough of the requirements to complete remedial activities and submit a Remedial Investigation Report by May 7, 2014. In August 2013, T&M provided the Borough with a schedule of activities required to be completed to meet this obligation, which included; updated public information, installation of ground water monitoring wells, and one (1) round of ground water sampling and analysis. 

Privilege of the Floor

Mayor Altomonte opened the Privilege of the Floor.

Neil Mendelsohn, Broad Street. Mr. Mendelsohn stated he was happy with Council's reappointment of Mr. Menna, and thanked Mr. Ferrara for a job well done. Mr. Mendelsohn requests broader dissemination of information, specifically in relation to redevelopment as he strongly objects to Broad Street Plaza especially when his application to the Planning Zoning Board was denied for a rental property on his lot. Mr. Mendelsohn informed of the Tax Assessor's lack of response to questions on his property's assessment stating Mr. Ferrara is working with the Tax Assessor on his behalf. Mr. Mendelsohn informed the Park Avenue Sanitary Sewer Project sewer pipe installation on his property did not restore his property to its original condition. Mr. Keady informed he is working with the contractor to remedy the situation. Mr. Mendelsohn related during his time on Council an Ordinance 06-29 originally adopted was to have required developers to support Borough recreation areas. The Ordinance, as adopted, provides for recreation space on the development lot not for the Borough as a whole. Mr. Mendelsohn did not like the January 1, 2016 Reorganization Meeting lack of Privilege of the Floor. The Mayor apologized stating he was advised the Reorganization Agenda should be exclusive to its purpose.

Deborah Sajeski, 231 Victoria Court. Ms. Sajeski expressed frustration with a neighbor's construction of a skateboard park in their backyard. Mr. Ferrara informed Messrs. Quinn and Marr, the Property Maintenance Official, have issued violations and are working to remedy the situation. Mr. Ferrara will contact Ms. Sajeski to keep her as well as Mr. Menna informed.

Craig Gately, 257 Harding Boulevard. Mr. Gately welcomed the Mayor and new Council members. Mr. Gately related multiple tax appeals made, and his dissatisfaction with the lack of a freeze on the current Assessment Demonstration Program asking the Borough's status with the Program. Mr. Menna stated the Council has until April 2016 to make a formal decision on the issue, and will be discussing prior to that time with the proper notice on those discussions made to the public. Mr. Menna suggested Mr. Gately contact the Tax Assessor with regard to his tax stipulation. Mr. Ferrara informed of a recent ruling made by the Tax Board on the freeze and will provide the ruling to Mr. Gately. Mr. Gately related the Borough's tax rate is the highest in the County asking Council to make the necessary budget reductions, such as the Police Department, and look to a Police shared service. Mr. Gately stated development assists the tax base, and the Borough should welcome business and development.

Councilman Caldon agreed with Mr. Gately stating if the Borough does not do something to bring in more ratables, the tax payer's pocket suffers.

Mayor Altomonte closed the Privilege of the Floor.

Adjournment

Mayor Altomonte requested a motion to adjourn. Councilwoman Clifton made the motion, seconded by Councilwoman Gould. Council agreed. Motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 7:55 PM.
