- 2. That New Jersey Natural Gas Company shall conduct the work or the laying or maintaining of gas pipes therein in a careful and prudent manner and in accordance with all established Federal, State and Local applicable rules and regulations in place at the time of the event; and
- 3. That New Jersey Natural Gas Company shall safeguard the public interest in continuous and uninterrupted service at and after the expiration of the term of the grant; and
- 4. That New Jersey Natural Gas Company shall maintain its property in good order throughout the full term of the grant; and
- 5. That New Jersey Natural Gas Company shall continuously afford safe, adequate and proper service at just and reasonable rates as applicable under all Federal, State and BPU regulations.

ORDINANCE 19-20 AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF MATAWAN CHAPTER VII – TRAFFIC SECTION 7-41.1(i) PARKING AT THE RAILROAD STATION RULES, REGULATIONS AND PENALTIES
