WHEREAS, on March 10, 2015, the New Jersey Supreme Court issued its decision in the case of <u>In Re Adoption of N.J.A.C. 5:96 and 5:97 by NJ Council on Affordable Housing</u>, holding that enforcement of the Fair Housing Act ("FHA") and the <u>Mount Laurel</u> Doctrine be returned from the NJ Council on Affordable Housing ("COAH") to the New Jersey Superior Courts due to COAH's failure to adopt Third Round Rules on municipal affordable housing obligations; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Supreme Court provided that a municipality such as the Borough of Matawan ("Borough") may file a declaratory judgment action in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Law Division to seek a judicial declaration that the municipality's affordable housing plan presents a realistic opportunity for the provision of its fair share of present and prospective need for low- and moderate-income housing, such that the municipality may receive from the courts the judicial equivalent of substantive certification and accompanying protection as afforded under the FHA; and

**WHEREAS**, the Supreme Court ruled that a municipality's Third Round fair share obligation and Housing Element & Fair Share Plan ("HEFSP") must be evaluated under the prior round methodology; and

WHEREAS, the Borough is currently preparing a HEFSP and, in light of existing development within the Borough that incorporates affordable housing units and potential development and redevelopment opportunities that are now or may soon be available, the Borough believes it can successfully obtain a judicial declaration that it has complied with its constitutional affordable housing obligation; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Matawan (the "Council") deems it to be in the best interest of the Borough and its residents to authorize Borough Special Counsel to file a declaratory judgment action seeking judicial approval of the Borough's compliance with its Third Round affordable housing obligation, along with a motion seeking temporary immunity from third party lawsuits while the Borough pursues the declaratory judgment action;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Matawan, County of Middlesex and State of New Jersey, that it hereby authorizes the Borough Special Counsel to file a declaratory judgment action with the trial court to seek judicial approval of the Borough's compliance with its Third Round affordable housing obligation, along with a motion seeking temporary immunity from third party lawsuits while the Borough pursues the declaratory judgment action, and any other actions deemed necessary in accordance therewith; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Mayor and the Borough Administrator of the Borough of Matawan are hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to implement and effectuate this Resolution; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.
